#### Corrections to the text

Dedication to include Tyler Roy-Hart

There was a time period in 2021 when I was finalizing the book in order to get it to the printer, and Tyler Roy-Hart had previously joined the Jerry Base team several months before. I was focused on my deadline, and getting the formatting of the On This Day section correct and I forgot to include Tyler in the Dedication section. That section should read as follows (page 3, paragraph 4):

A third big special “thank you” goes out to the fine folks at JerryBase.com. I started collaborating with Joe Jupille, who authors the *Jerry Garcia’s Middle Finger* blog, Michael Jacobs, the programming wizard behind the website, and Tyler Roy-Hart, the site’s user interface design expert. What we’ve created is the world’s most complete and updated set list searching website, so Dead Heads finally have a single place to search all the Grateful Dead set lists as well as Jerry Garcia side project set lists in one place. I recommend you use JerryBase as the primary way to get access to the recordings, but you can of course use whatever method you’re most comfortable with.

## Changes 11/9/2021

### 1970-07-11

- Old ShowID = 602 – Needs to become ShowID = 603 and change the date as well.
- Set list and tapes are misdated. Everything listed for 1970-07-11 is actually from 1970-07-12 (and vice versa).
- This is the last night of the 4-show run and Pigpen doesn't sing at all. His voice is blown out with laryngitis.

- Show Certainty and Setlist Status should also be changed accordingly
- JerryBase will continue to list this as 1970-08-05 because PostgreSQL doesn't support "00" in a date field and because that's the date most people will search for or know this by. However, I'm changing my database to 1970-07-00 because the version of MySQL that I use supports "00" in dates. My personal belief is that listing it as 1970-07-00 is more factual and helps prevent the spreading of incorrect dates.

Robert attended this show in the front row and described some banter at the beginning of the show: While the Dead was tuning up, a deejay from KRLA (I think) came out for a forced hip intro. He said, "The last time the Dead played here was at a benefit for Timothy Leary and no one got very high". Someone from the band murmured and the deejay added, "except the Dead". After "Lovelight" they came out and tuned up for an encore, but, after several minutes, decided just to sing "We Bid You Goodnight" and left. Phil Lesh came back onstage a few minutes later to retrieve his leather jacket.

For example, pictured in the photos is a recent mystery reel preserved by a patron that still contained some interesting material. We thought it was going to be just a dub of John Mayall, which turned out to be true, but the "practice" referenced on the box was actually a Grateful Dead rehearsal where they were working out the St. Stephen>The Eleven bridge. As we explained to the patron, the recording is choppy and mixed in with snippets from live GD performances, which suggests that it was a tape that Bear frequently taped over, but GD practice sessions of any length and coherence are always interesting, so this was not an insignificant preservation effort. Just one example of the kinds of things we are finding on mystery reels and tapes otherwise labeled as dubs.
